



KNOW YOUR DATABASES! FREE TO UNIVERSITY MEMBERS.

The direct URL for use 'on-campus' (i.e. from a machine on the university network) is provided in the DATABASE column. 'Off-campus' access (i.e. from outside of the university network) is always via Raven password. The easiest way to do this is to go to eresources@cambridge <http://www.lib.cam.ac.uk/eresources/index.php>, click on the 'databases' tab, then click on the appropriate letter on the 'browse by title' A-Z. Select the database name and the Raven login box should appear on-screen. You should only have to login once per session.

 <p>BIRDS OF NORTH AMERICA ONLINE (CORNELL LAB OF ORNITHOLOGY) http://bna.birds.cornell.edu/bna/</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Comprehensive life histories for each of the 716+ species of birds breeding in the USA (including Hawaii). • You can search for species by common or scientific name, and you can browse these. • Account contents are frequently updated, with contributions from researchers, citizen scientists, and designated reviewers and editors. • There are image and video galleries showing plumages, behaviours, habitat, nests and eggs, and more. • Most accounts now feature recordings of the songs and calls of their species, selected from the extensive collection of Cornell's Macaulay Library http://macaulaylibrary.org/
 <p>SCOPUS (ELSEVIER) http://www.scopus.com/home.url</p>	<p>Indexes more than 19,500 titles:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 18,500 peer-reviewed journals (including 1,800 Open Access journals); • 400 trade publications; • 340 book series; • 4.9 million conference proceedings; • 47 million records.

	<p>Why use Scopus?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Find out who is citing you, and how many citations an article or an author has received. • Analyze citations for a particular journal issue, volume or year. • Use the refine results overview to quickly see the main journals, disciplines and authors that publish in your area of interest. • Check out the work and citations of other authors. • Click on the cited by and reference links to track research trends and make connections. You can do this within or across disciplines you are interested in. • Data export via bibliographic managers such as RefWorks, EndNote and BibTeX. • SciVerse Scopus alerts, available for iPhone and Android devices. • iPhone application. • Link to the full text where the journal is subscribed to by the university.

Raven password ALWAYS required for this resource.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Search over 12,000 journals and 120,000 conference proceedings across the sciences, social sciences, and arts and humanities to find the high quality research most relevant to your area of interest. • Link between relevant research using the cited references and explore the subject connections between articles that are established by the expert researchers working in your field. • Export your results to EndNote, Reference Manager, or similar bibliographic management tool. • Mobile interface. • Link to the full text where the journal is subscribed to by the university.

Raven password ALWAYS required for this resource.</p>	<p>To help you compare journals and discover which are the most significant to you, JCR can show:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Most frequently cited journals in a field; • Hottest journals in a field; • Highest impact factors in a field; • Most published articles in a field.

 <p>ZETOC: Electronic Table of Contents (British Library via MIMAS) http://zetoc.mimas.ac.uk/</p>	<p>The Zetoc service provides Z39.50-compliant access to the British Library's Electronic Table of Contents (ETOC). The database gives access to over 28,000 journals, >50 million article citations and conference papers. Zetoc covers every imaginable subject including science, technology, medicine. The database covers the years from 1993 to date and is updated daily.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Zetoc search: General Search for both journal articles and conference proceedings, Journal Search to search for journal articles, and Conference Search to search for just conference proceedings. • Zetoc alert: current awareness service that sends you email alerts matching the search criteria that you have provided. The searches may be for particular journals, for authors and for keywords from the titles of articles and papers. • Zetoc RSS: enables you to subscribe to feeds for individual journals. You can subscribe to the feed in various ways, depending on your chosen RSS reader. • You can export to bibliographic management software. • Link to the full text where the journal is subscribed to by the university.
 <p>SCIENCEDIRECT (ELSEVIER) http://www.sciencedirect.com/</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ScienceDirect is a leading full-text scientific database offering journal articles and book chapters from more than 2,500 peer-reviewed journals and more than 11,000 books. • There are currently more than 11 million articles/chapters, a content base that is growing at a rate of almost 0.5 million additions per year. • Elsevier has digitized as much of the pre 1995 journal owned-content as possible, bringing articles from as far back as 1823 (The Lancet) to the desktop. • SciVerse Mobile Applications enables you to share scientific information via email and through your smart phone, set up alerts, see who is citing your work and make notes on the go.

Please see this page for more information on how to obtain the full text of theses from around the world, often for free: http://www.zoo.cam.ac.uk/library/theses.html. • You can save your search results, mail them, cite them, or export them to various bibliographic management software packages.
